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HLTAID004 Provide an Emergency First Aid Response in an Education and Care Setting

This training provides the skills and knowledge required to provide a first aid response to infants, children and adults.

The training applies to educators and support staff working within an education and care setting who are required to respond to a first aid emergency, including asthmatic and anaphylactic emergencies.

The Australian Children's Education & Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) recommends HLTAID004 as satisfying all educator requirements for first aid, anaphylaxis management and emergency asthma training.

The training is useful for parents, carers, babysitters or other people who may frequently have children or babies in their care.

Language Literacy and Numeracy

Candidates should be able to read and write English at approximately a grade 12 level. Reasonable computer skills and access to email and internet are strongly recommended.

Pre-requisites

There are no prerequisite for this unit, however training packages describes the candidates must have Foundation Skills (language, literacy and numeracy) that are essential to perform oral communication in order to make an accurate verbal report to emergency response services and workplace supervisor and; Written communication skills to complete an incident report in line with organisational policies.

Course outcome

The HLTAID004 Provide an emergency first aid response in an education and care setting unit of competency is derived from the HLT Health Training Package and is accepted by ACECQA as an industry standard first aid qualification.

On successful completion of this training program a Statement of Attainment in HLTAID004 Provide an emergency first aid response in an education and care setting will be issued to the participants. Students will receive their Statement of Attainment within five working days from the date of completion of the course through express post.

Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) guidelines indicate that a (Cardiopulmonary resuscitation) CPR qualification should be renewed every 12 months and that a First Aid qualification should be renewed every 3 years.

Course Duration and Delivery Method

Blended delivery required almost 6 – 8 hours self-study and completion of work book and one (1) day of face to face (6 – 8hours) classroom based practical training, theory and practical assessment.

The competencies to be achieved during the training program

Training includes the following that relates to appropriate to children setting:

- Emergency life support and cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- Convulsions
- Poisoning
- Respiratory difficulties
- Management of severe bleeding
- Injury and basic wound care
- Administration of an auto-immune adrenalin device
- Recognizing asthma emergencies
- Medication and devices and asthma first aid
- Anaphylactic symptom and triggers
- Recognition and management of anaphylactic shock reaction
- Risk minimization and management strategies for allergic reaction and anaphylaxis
- Administration of adrenaline (e.g. EpiPen and Anapen) and resuscitation
- First aid management of service allergic reactions and anaphylaxis
- Symptoms and management of cardiac arrest
- Managing choking and airway obstruction
- Managing envenomation (using pressure immobilisation)
- Managing epilepsy and seizures

- Fractures, sprains and strains (using arm slings, roller bandages or other appropriate immobilisation techniques)
- managing head injuries, respiratory distress and shock
- use of Automated External Defibrillator (AED)

Assessments and Course Procedure

Submit expression of interest to the advertised course by contacting through our website, email or on phone

- Be provided with the Students handbook, a copy of the Course Flyer and the Enrolment form.
- Be enrolled in the course, through completion of the Enrolment form
- Get confirmed your enrolment through email receipt or phone call by our staff.
- Be issued with the learning materials for the course (first aid manual and First aid workbook)
- Participants need to use the work book in conjunction with manual and required to answer each question in the corresponding section of the workbook.
- Completed workbook need to be returned to prior or on the day to your attendance at the practical course components. This is mandatory if the workbook is not completed prior to the course the participant will not be able to attend the classroom training session.
- During classroom training all the candidates will be assessed for skills in performing first aid procedures through demonstration and with questioning to confirm essential knowledge.
- For assessment purposes, demonstration of skills in CPR procedures requires using a model of the human body (resuscitation manikin) in line with Australian Resuscitation Council Guidelines.

Pathways

Participants seeking further training options to enhance their skill set such as HLTAID007 Provide advanced resuscitation or may undertake a range of qualifications from the HLT Health Training Package.

Recognition of prior Learning (RPL)

Vigil Training College offers RPL in HLTAID004 Provide an emergency first aid response in an education and care setting course.
