COURSE OVERVIEW

Vigil Training College offers a Nationally Recognised training program that meets the requirements of CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry and fulfil the SafeWork NSW **General Construction requirement Induction Card**. The course is also commonly known as the **White Card** course and was previously known as the **Green Card** course.

General construction induction training course aims to provide awareness and understanding of rights and responsibilities under WHS law to identify common hazards and risks associated with the construction industry, basic risk management principles, and the standard of behaviour expected of workers on construction sites.

This training is a mandatory requirement under the Work Health Safety Regulation 2017 for those:

- carrying out construction work in NSW, including site managers, supervisors, surveyors, architects, labourers, tradespersons
- people who access operational construction zones unaccompanied or not directly supervised by an inducted person, and
- other workers whose employment causes them to routinely enter construction zones, e.g., security officers working on construction sites.

Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) accredited by the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA) can deliver the white card training.

COURSE PRE-REQUISITES

There are no formal educational requirements for this program.

Language, Literacy and Numeracy:

Training and assessments throughout the course are conducted in English only. The training mandates that all participants seeking admission into the course have sufficient communication and comprehension skills to:

- clarify WHS legislative requirements;
- verbally report construction hazards and risks, and ask effective questions.
- relay information to others and discuss WHS issues and information
- explain the meaning of safety signs and symbols
- identify common construction hazards

Vigil will provide some support and assistance, in line with guidelines, if a student requires support in understanding the content. However, if the support required by a students exceeds the support we can provide, we will refer you to a suitable organisation to assist you further, like TAFE.

COURSE STRUCTURE

Course Duration:

The duration of the course is at least 6.0 hours (Excluding break and administration time).

Mode of Delivery:

The training program is delivered face-to-face in a classroom setting, typically at a Vigil Training College arranged venue or at a client's venue.

Students requiring special facilities at our training sites, should advise us prior to the commencement of the course through the student enrolment form or contact our administration staff to ensure that your needs are catered for. This may range from access, dietary needs or special requirements for the training methods used in the course.

Course Contents:

The competency unit CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry is a training program that provides workers in the construction industry with an awareness and understanding of:

- their rights and responsibilities under Work Health and Safety law;
- common hazards and risks in the construction industry;
- basic risk management principles; and
- the standard of behaviour expected of workers on construction sites.

Assessment Methods:

Your knowledge and skills are assessed through written short question and answer knowledge-based open book assessment, case studies and problem-solving activities.

Awards:

Upon completing this training program, the participant will receive:

- a Statement of Attainment in "CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry"; and

- a SafeWork NSW Statement of Training (SOT) for General Construction Induction Training

You will receive the SOT on the day of completion of the course. SafeWork NSW SOT is valid for 60 days from the date of issue and can be evidence of completed general induction training.

Students completing this course will also receive SafeWork NSW **Construction Induction Card** known as **White Card** and previously known as **Green Card**.

Construction Induction Card :

The **Construction Induction Card** supplied by SafeWork NSW required to carry out construction work.

SOT allows you to work immediately for 60 days until you receive your White Card/Construction Card, generally posted by SafeWork NSW within 30 days.

The White card ceases to be current if you have not carried out construction work for any consecutive period of two years or more.

The card fee is set independently by our RTO with SafeWork included in the course fee, i.e. you need not pay any extra fee for this card.

EVIDENCE OF IDENTITY

You must complete the Evidence of Identity (EOI) form and present original documents showing your name, photo, date of birth, signature and current address to the value of 100 points to the trainer or assessor on the day of attending the course.

The commonly used combinations of evidence of identity documents include:

- an Australian birth certificate and an Australian driver's licence, or
- an Australian drivers licence, Medicare card, ATM card and a utility bill

Special provisions for EOI may apply to GIT for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, school students, overseas persons who have been in Australia for less than six weeks and correctional centre inmates as mentioned in the above EOI form.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL)

There is no RPL available in this course.

PATHWAYS

The unit of competence in this course (CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to Work safely in the construction industry) is a core unit of CPC10120 - Certificate I in Construction in Construction. The candidate seeking further education can receive a credit transfer in the qualification. Adding GIT within the CPC training package aims to prepare people for real jobs in the construction sector.
